### Colonel Peter F. Davey, USA AF Director of Management and United States Senior National Representative



Colonel Peter F. Davey is the Director of Management (DOM), Commander AF Element and U.S. Senior National Representative of Headquarters Allied Air Command, North Atlantic Treaty Organization, Ramstein Air Base, Germany.

In this position, Colonel Davey is the spokesperson for the 4-star Commander on all issues affecting Joint US personnel assigned to NATO Air Command. Furthermore, he leads 130 US personnel at 3 geographically separated locations supporting one Joint Air Headquarters and two Combined Air Operations Centers. As the DOS, he guides over 9 divisions, advocates and ensures the Commander policies for a 500+ member international headquarters is realized. Furthermore, he manages all HQ Operational support activities in Afghanistan, pan-European air policing and NATO Response Force.

Colonel Davey graduated from the United States Air Force Academy in 1986 and attended Undergraduate Pilot Training at Williams AFB, AZ. He remained as a T-38 First Assignment Instructor Pilot graduating as a Distinguished Graduate from Pilot Instructor Training. He transitioned to the F-16 in 1991, graduated overall Top Gun and Distinguished Graduate. He has been an F-16 Instructor Pilot in five MAJCOMs and been awarded the F-16 Instructor Pilot of the Year award for four consecutive years. He recently deployed as the CAOC Battle Director in support of Operations Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, and New Dawn. Colonel Davey has served as an AOC Commander, Deputy Group Commander, an F-16 Squadron Commander, Operations Officer, Chief of Wing Safety, Director of Wing Plans, Assistant Operations Officer, and Flight Commander. He is a Command Pilot with over 4,600 flying hours, including more than 250 combat hours.
